GSU is offering an EXPERIMENTAL FILM & MEDIA PRODUCTION class in the Fall of 2015.

This advanced film/video production class embraces a combo platter of fictional, documentary, and hybrid approaches to filmmaking that can take the form of stand-alone films, video art, performance, installation, multi channel, and/or new media works. The end results are 3 portfolio ready films or artworks that could be beautiful, noisy, abstract, poetic/lyrical, political, queer, cameraless/mashed up, structuralist, strange, Surrealist, Dadaist, rebellious, subversive, avant-garde, conceptual, highly personal, confessional, autobiographical, animated, accessible, theoretical, crowd sourced, participatory, oddball, unorthodox, kitschy, reflexive, meta, para, impressionistic, atmospheric, underground, anthropological, non-traditional, non-narrative, non-linear, innovative, and/or, otherwise, just plain ol' weird and uncategorizable.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

- EXPERIMENTAL FILM & MEDIA PRODUCTION (4 credit hours)

An advanced production course that explores highly-personal avant-garde and experimental mediamaking by any means necessary, including but not limited to: experimental documentary and fiction, found footage/cameraless filmmaking, new media, web video, mobile media, video art, installation, etc.

PREFERRED PREREQUISITES:

- Undergraduates should have a 3.0 or better GPA and Production I (FILM 4120) or equivalent digital video or production experience.

- Art, Music, and other non-Film majors and graduate students should contact instructor to discuss equivalent digital video, audio, photo, new media, etc. production experience.
